\*Research shows that the more a child is read to, and the more a child reads, the better reader they will become and the more success they will have in school!


\*Plus, reading with a parent and child is fun!

## What Should We Read?

Read anything that will interest your child! Visit the public library and check out a wide variety of books that will capture the interest of your rising second grader. If your child is reading independently, I suggest alternating between solo reading and reading aloud to your child. Audiobooks also count!

You know I love books! Here are some popular books at Crane's Brittingham Family Library.



Bink & Gollie by Kate DiCamillo

Two unlikely best friends find that their differences make their friendship stronger. The illustrations are graphic novel-style and are favorites with students this age. There are three books and you can buy them all in one big collection if you choose.

George and Martha series by James Marshall

Your child with love these two hippos who are best friends and teach the true meaning of friendship.



Magic Tree House series by Mary Pope Osbourne This author helps kids explore geography and history by having her two intrepid characters travel to different times and places and solve mysteries along the way. There are over 55 Magic Tree House titles and another coming soon.

#### Nonfiction Companions to Magic Tree House series

Beginning readers get to follow Commander Toad in his many adventures in outer space as he explores and keeps the peace in the universe.







#### Dog Man by Dav Pilkey

From the creator of Captain Underpants comes this popular graphic novel series about a part human, part dog hero who fights crime. This series is "created by" George and Harold, the two friends who created Captain Underpants. These books are constantly checked out.and are frequently re-read by our students.

#### **DK Readers- many different titles** available

Many levels of readers are available on popular and interesting nonfiction subjects. Read about knights, Star Wars, sports, and many other topics from science and history. These are very engaging and visually rich.




